


OCC 2022 Financial Report

OCC began 2022 with continuing unknowns related to the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic. Our Budget was built around the assumption that pandemic limitations would continue to effect operations through mid-year. We hoped that limitations to our in-person events and programs would then begin to ease. In general, this this assumption played out as anticipated with the May Fine Arts Fair successfully welcoming the Community as an in-person event. Other popular programs continued to expand during the year with the Road Rally and Community Happy Hour providing welcome Town gatherings. It was the 40th anniversary of the Community Center and 10th anniversary of the renovations. A big year honoring the people that created the mission of the Center to serve the community.

Containing OCC's day-to-day operating expenses was a challenge in 2022. Inflation and the high cost of utilities were a battle all year long. In addition, as we began to ramp-up new events and programs, additional personnel and technology support was required.

To support OCC's operating expense budget, Liza with help from others, worked to secure several outside grants. The Town of Oxford continued to help fund our operating budget with a continuing gift of \$10K. However, and most importantly, the Community's support of the Annual Fund Drive remains the most critical component of OCC's operating budget. During 2022 the Annual Fund Drive reached a record of over \$126K. The OCC Board of Trustees is incredibly grateful to the Community for their support during another challenging year.
